


VIRGINIA'S HARD TO COUNT COMMUNITIES

As of 2018, the Hispanic and Latinx population make up 9.4% of Virginia's population.(1)





KEY CHALLENGES



Language Barriers: Almost a third of Hispanics (31 percent) speak English less than "very well." Historically, areas with low rates of English proficiency have been undercounted. (4)



Poverty: Hispanics have an official poverty rate of 21 percent, significantly higher than the official U.S. poverty rate of 13 percent. It is widely believed that households in poverty are difficult to enumerate. (4)



Education: More than 60 percent of Hispanic adults have a high school degree or didn't complete high school, compared to 40 percent of the total population. Areas with lower educational attainment are also hard to enumerate. (4)

IMMIGRATION



Immigrant families report feeling fear and intimidation due to the current political climate.

Trusted voices are necessary to enure an accurate count. (2)
